

Along with fertilizer issue and cost, now is the time to utilize a grazing plan. Strengthening your pasture now, means you may need less hay in the fall and winter. And for folks that purchase hay, now is the time to get your name on the hay dealer's list.

Another compounding problem is poisonous plants to livestock. Phil has been busy with these types of question in the past few weeks. Many poisonous plants emerge in the early spring and often gain an advantage over grass. Most factors contributing to plant poisoning are starvation, accidental, and browsing habits of animals.
