4-H Cooking



Wilkes County 3rd Grade Ag Awareness Day

Madaline had an awesome time educating students on November 3, 2022 at the Wilkes County Ag Awareness Day. During this event, students rotated through 14 eight-minute stations where they learned about the different aspects of Agriculture. Madaline lead the Horticulture station. She taught students the life cycle of plants, from the seed, young plant, mature plant, flower, and then fruit. Along with leaves taking in sunlight and produce food through photosynthesis. After her short educational teaching, the kids had hands-on planting. Each student planted a sunflower seed to take back to class with them to watch the life cycle of germination, roots, stem, and leaves.

This is a great opportunity to teach our youth about Agriculture. For many student Ag Awareness Days are their first encounter with Agriculture topics.
