If you are participating in any 4-H Summer Fun workshops, you **MUST** have a 4-H Online Account. Please use this link to create an account or to re-enroll: <https://v2.4honline.com>. If you are not in a club, please register as “Yadkin County Members at Large” when asked which club you attend. Have questions? Please contact Ms. Madaline!

We go by 4-H age, which is the age you were as of January 1, 2024. The age you were at this date is the age you will remain the rest of the year in 4-H. This means that your child must be at least 5 as of January 1, 2024 to sign up for these programs.

Wednesday, May 15th is the first registration day for 4-H Summer Fun!!! The earlier you sign up the better because, spots will go fast! However, if spots remain, you can still sign up for a workshop up to two weeks before it begins, unless otherwise noted. Clover Cash, check, or cash can be used to pay for these programs. Please make checks out to “Yadkin County 4-H.”

Stone Mountain Adventure

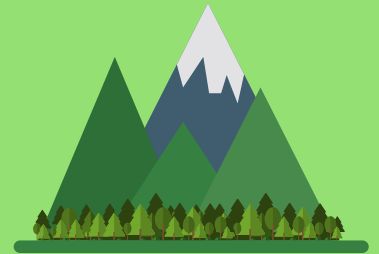

Sewing up SO Much Fun!-Mini Edition

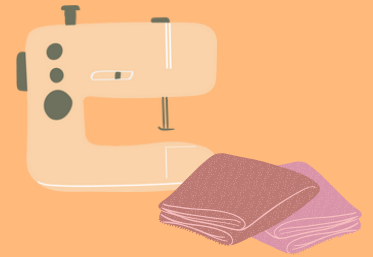

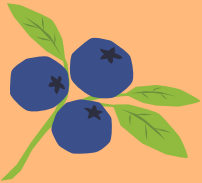

Summer Fun Rules

Make sure to read this section **THROUGHLY** before you sign up for programs this summer

Time and Location: Activities will be held at the Yadkin County Cooperative Extension Office kitchen, unless otherwise noted; many trips will also depart from and return to this location. Our address is 2051 Agricultural Way, Yadkinville, NC 27055. A parent/guardian must accompany the child into the building and sign the participant in and indicate who will be picking up the child. A parent/guardian must also come in and sign out each participant in order for them to leave. We promise to be as prompt as possible about returning from trips and finishing the program. For the safety of your child, as well as consideration of instructors and Extension staff, **please do not bring your child more than 10 minutes early to an event.** We will not allow you to leave child at the event until after this time.

Registration: This year we will be taking registration through **4-H Online Events** UNLESS you are signing up to drive your own children to an event such as the Grandfather Mountain, Stone Mountain, etc.. If you are signing up to take your child on one of these trips, please contact Madaline Jones and she will get you signed up. If assistance is needed signing up through 4-H Online, please contact Madaline Jones and she will help you through it. Registration for each event will stay open until two weeks prior to the event; HOWEVER, spots will go fast so we encourage you to sign up as early as possible. You are not fully registered for a class until payment is received.

Fees: The fee for each class covers the cost of a snack when appropriate, transportation, insurance, and program cost, unless otherwise noted in the description. Refunds will only be made if the class is cancelled by our office. Checks and only exact change are accepted; the office does not keep cash for change on hand. Please make out checks to, "Yadkin County 4-H." Debit and credit cards are **not** accepted. Clover Cash that has been earned by the 4-H'er through competitions may be used to pay for these events; however, the 4-H Agent must be notified of this to check and see what their balance is (if the 4-H'er has not been in a 4-H competition, they have not earned Clover Cash). When you sign up, we will hold your spots for two weeks without payment. After two weeks, we will open up the spot to another 4-H'er. However, payment plans can be made under special circumstances. Please ask about this upon registration if interested.

4-H Enrollment: 4-H Online enrollment of each 4-H'er is required by North Carolina State 4-H. If Spanish forms are needed, they can be given upon request. Please make sure to fill out the full 4-H Online Account and make a profile for each child you are enrolling before registering them in 4-H Summer Fun. Please use this link to create an account or to re-enroll: <https://nc.4honline.com>. If your child is not in a club, please register as "Yadkin County Members at Large" when asked which club your child attends. If you have questions or concerns, please contact Ms. Madaline and she will be happy to help.

Drop Out Policy: In the event that your child drops out of a class, you are expected to still pay for the spot you reserved unless we can replace it. If dropping out of classes begins to become a habit, we do have the right to reject youth from classes.

Additional Information: At all programs at the the Cooperative Extension Office, there will be a refrigerator to put your lunch in. Please bring a reusable water bottle to every workshop as we try to make better choices for our environment. It's always a great idea to wear closed toed shoes (unless we will be in the water) to our classes to ensure safety. We understand that many youth today have electronics that they have with them at all times. We do ask that they keep them put away during programs unless they are needed needed for an activity or for emergencies. We are also not liable if your child loses or damages their electronics or other possessions while at any of our programs.
